- Increase % A-C Year 9 Science Term 1 from 74.3% to 81% and Term 3, from 85.3% to 90%
- Increase % A-C Year 9 Humanities Term 1 from 40% to 52% and Term 3, from 64.7% to 74.7%
- Increase attendance from 87% in 2021 to 90%
